Karger receives forestry award

Ned Karger, silvicultural manager at Kane Hardwood, was awarded the Robert W. Bauer Outstanding Service to Forestry Award at the annual Allegheny Society of American Foresters (ASAF) meeting held recently in Lancaster. The ASAF includes chapters and divisions within N.J., Md., Del., W.Va. and Pa.

The award is presented to recognize professional achievement in the field of forestry, leadership within the SAF (Society of American Foresters) and service to local and regional organizations.
